After the Revolution when the Bolshevik ordered land redistribution, the Russian army began to break. Soldiers, most of them whom were peasants, wanted to go home for the redistribution. There were many

who condemned the uprising. During 1918-1919 the 'Greens' (Socialist Revolutionaries) and 'Whites' (Pro-Tsarists) were in control of most parts of Russia. Their leaders moved to South Russia and organized troops to fight the Bolsheviks (The Red's). These troops were being supported by France, America, Britain and Japan. So these troops and the Bolsheviks fought a civil war. By January 1920, the Bolsheviks controlled most of the former Russian empire. The Bolsheviks got full support from the non-Russian nationalities and Muslim population. The provinces which were under the control of non-Russian nationalities were given political autonomy.

The Eastern Ghats are discontinuous and irregular and dissected by rivers draining into the Bay of Bengal. Mahendragiri (1,501 meters) is the highest peak in the Eastern Ghats. Shevroy Hills and the Javadi Hills are located to the southeast of the Eastern Ghats. One of the distinct features of the peninsular plateau is the black soil area known as Deccan Trap. This is of volcanic origin hence the rocks are igneous. Actually these rocks have denuded over time and are responsible for the formation of black soil.
